Are you carrying around hurt and brokenness in your life as a result of it?

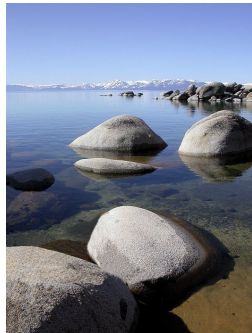
Do you feel as though you are alone in your brokenness?

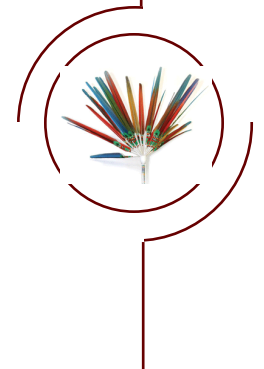

The heart of the circle is to lovingly care without condemnation, alienation or self-righteousness.

You are not alone. The circle provides opportunities for everyone to listen, encourage and uplift one another.

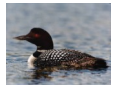
We will not attempt to solve everyone's problems.

Our Purpose

The purpose of a Circle of Comfort is to provide hope, encourage hurting individuals, and help them understand, regardless of their circumstances, that they are not alone and that others do care.

Many feel lost, alone, and unable to seek help because of the guilt, shame, and despair they feel.

The Circle of Comfort provides a source of encouragement, reassurance, laughter and a safe environment designed to assist hurting people find forgiveness and work their way through the pain of both the past and the present through a restorative process.



Restorative process – as a proactive and preventive tool to reduce crime & conflict, to create safe and peaceful communities:

The first step is willingness for change to create environments in schools or communities that foster character education. The second step is to put into practice those values underlying restorative justice such as respect, compassion, empathy, listening and honesty as a means to “build” healthy and peaceful communities.
